At Home in Harrison: Entrepreneurship Fair Celebrates Black History Month

For the second year in a row, the Redeemer ArtPlace cohort celebrated the future of Black neighborhood economics with a Black Entrepreneurship Fair on Saturday, February 29th. This event focused on Black entrepreneurship as a viable strategy for combating gentrification and displacement in North Minneapolis.

Several local entrepreneurs gathered to promote and present a diverse set of products such as Ms. Opal's natural oils and fragrances, a new jewelry business called Floss Dental Jewelry, and Henna designs created by a young Minneapolis artist. Leslie Redmond, Minneapolis NAACP President, also shared her experience of entrepreneurship through her Don't Complain Activate campaign, where she serves as a public speaker, moderator, podcast host, and community organizer.

Pending the status of the pandemic, the Redeemer ArtPlace Cohort will conclude their year-long creative place-making engagement with an event focusing on Environmental Justice and Climate Impacts in May. The group envisions a final event to celebrate and connect neighborhood stakeholders that will include a spring clean-up of the neighborhood, education around environmental sustainability, and a celebration of the planting season!
